***Remember to ask for a Crisis Intervention trained (CIT) officer to respond. These officers have had training on mental health.***

You can also remain calm and inform the dispatcher they are responding to a call for a person with mental illness who is depressed, suicidal, anxious, etc.

The more information officers have prior to engaging your family member, the better equipped they will be to negotiate a favorable outcome. Ask if the Monterey County Mobile Crisis team can respond with law enforcement.
